We appreciate all of you taking the time to read this email and appreciate all of the hard work you do for this town we love. My name is Patrick Collier and I live at 194 Ridge Street with my wife, Joslyn Capone. We are very grateful for the recent improvements that just went into the street and appreciate the new sidewalks that we use daily with our children. This is where my concern for safety rises to a level my wife and neighbors are uncomfortable with. While a traffic light at the Johnson/Ridge intersection has been discussed and might be warranted, the safety of the numerous children living on the street are of utmost concern to the new community that has descended upon Ridge Street in the past 4-5 years. It would be with great pleasure that I could talk further with the appropriate parties (Traffic Advisory Committee?) about things such as no truck designations (the 18-wheelers squeezing down the street are numerous now), crosswalks to access the back entrance to The Vinson-Owen School, speed bumps for the commuting traffic that blazes down the street unbeknownst to the dozen or so children under 10 on the street now. I have communicated this concern in the past and know other neighbors have done the same, I am hopeful that I would get the opportunity to know what is possible or answer any questions in regards to the safety of my own and our neighbors children on Ridge Street. Woburn stated that they have concerns with the noticed Green St route due to upcoming widening of Montvale Ave.

Woburn does, however, express openness to both the Cross-to-Holton in winchester route and the Crane Ct-to Medford St-to East St-to Sonar Dr-to Micro Drive-to Holton route.

The latter route avoids almost all the crowded residential streets ( Cross Street in Winchester, it also avoid green street in Woburn as well)

Since the latter route has much less residential houses and Town of Woburn has openness to this route, Could our town to be more firm in the siting board hearings for this option? and ask EFSB to let our town to work with Wobuen and Eversource to change to this route?

If this route could be chosen, the affects on both towns are minimized and it benefits both town of Winchester and Woburn, and residents from both town of Winchester and Woburn. It makes much sense.
